



### Effects of abuse, poverty & parental AIDS on female adolescent risk of transactional sex 57%



# Child abuse prevention: the evidence

- Systematic review of reviews: parenting programs best evidence (Mikton & Burchardt 2009)
- Good effect sizes in HIC trials (Barlow, 2006)
- Group-based programs = cheaper
- Problem: high costs of established programs
- Initial evidence of transportability to LMIC, mainly with younger children (Knerr et al, 2013)
- Better evidence for children than teens (Sherr et al, ICDP 2011)
- May be most valuable for families with HIV (Richter, 2013)
- Integrate with wider structural support (Richter, 2013)




# Parenting for Lifelong Health

- Non-professional staff, no materials needed
- Free: Creative Commons
- WHO and UNICEF: scale-up throughout SA and LMIC
- Thula Sana (pregnancy 6 months)
- Book sharing (toddlers)
- Sinovuyo Kids (ages 2-9)
- Sinovuyo Teen (ages 10-17)
- Group work,
- collaborative problem-solving
- Home practice, role-playing
- Evidence-based core principles

## Initial results

Increased involved parenting	p<.001, t=-4.91	p=.012, t=-2.69	
Increased positive parenting	p=.004, t=-3.17	p=.025, t=-2.48	
Increased caregiver social support	p=.001, t=-3.69		
Increased teen social support		p<.001, t=-5.19	
No changes: parent-child communication, non-violent discipline inconsistent discipline

# Feasibility

- High attendance rates (>75%)
- High participant satisfaction
- Good programme fidelity by lay workers

- Qualitative findings: need to simplify and reinforce skills-building
- Qualitative findings: add in economic strengthening?
